Recognize the Problem

A **mother's experience** during and after pregnancy impacts not only their health but also their baby's.

Stress caused by circumstance and racism can contribute to premature births and both infant and maternal deaths.

Understand the Statistics

Black/African American mothers are nearly **three times more likely to die** from pregnancy-related causes than Whites, Hispanics, and Asians.

Black/African American babies die at two times the rate of White, Hispanic, and Asian babies before they turn one.

"A Black woman is 22 percent more likely to die from heart disease than a white woman, 71 percent more likely to perish from cervical cancer, and 243 percent more likely to die from pregnancy or childbirth-related causes."
