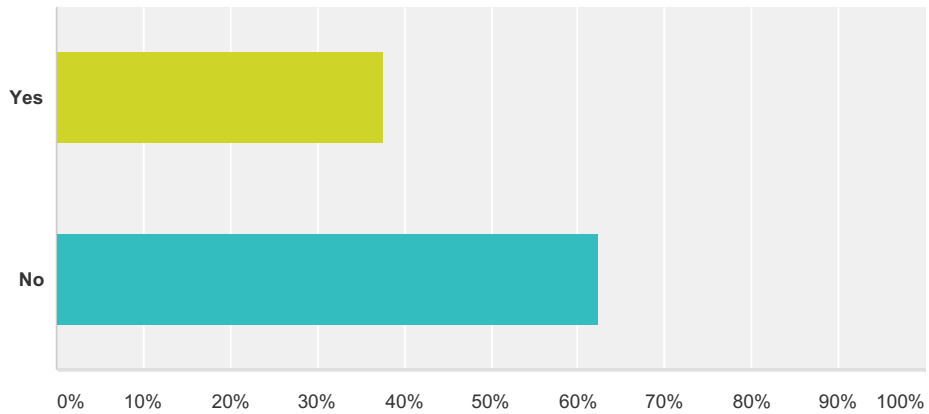

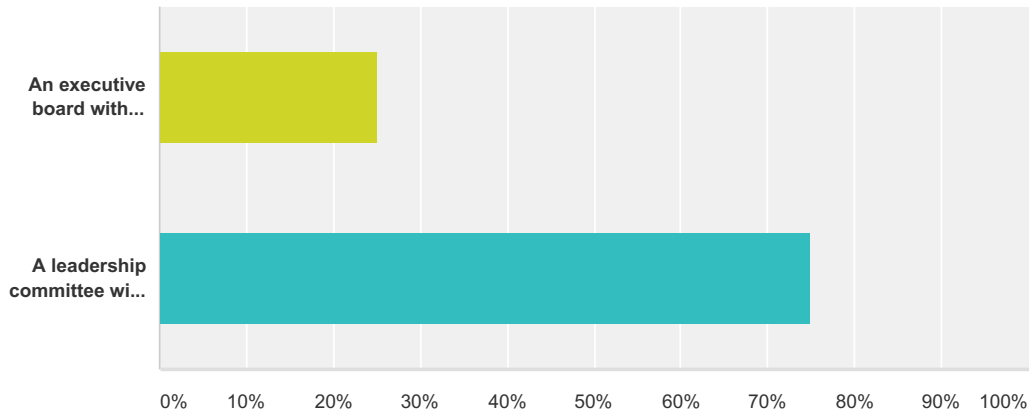

Q2 Which type of coalition leadership structure would you prefer?

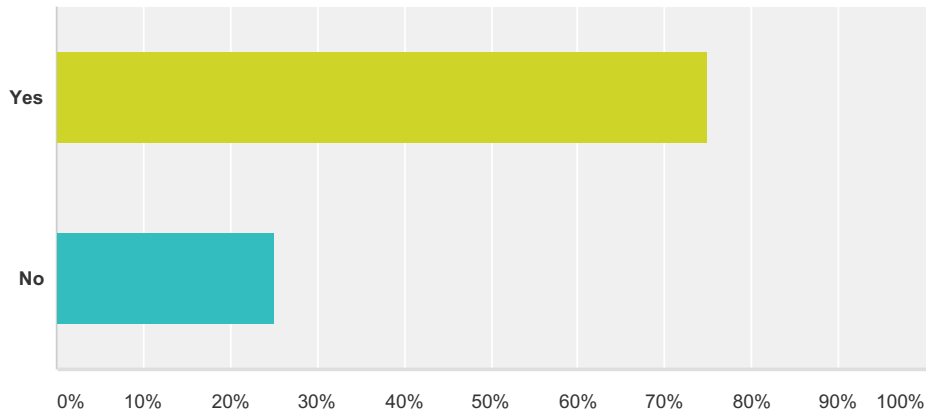

Q3 Would you be willing to be part of the coalition leadership team?

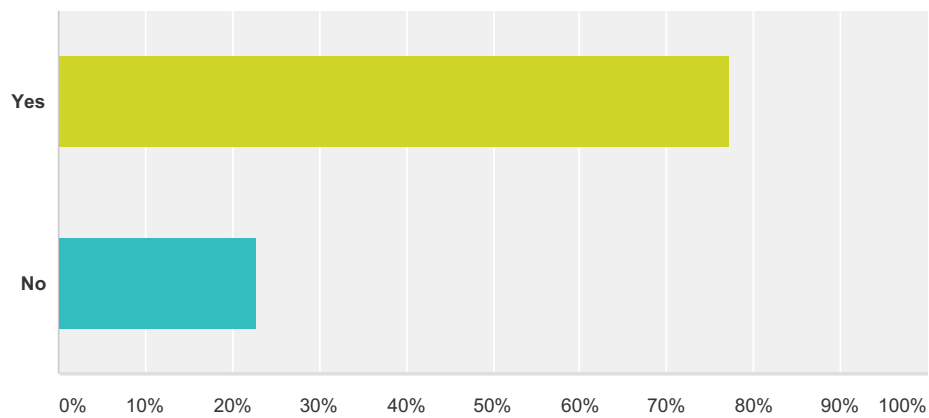

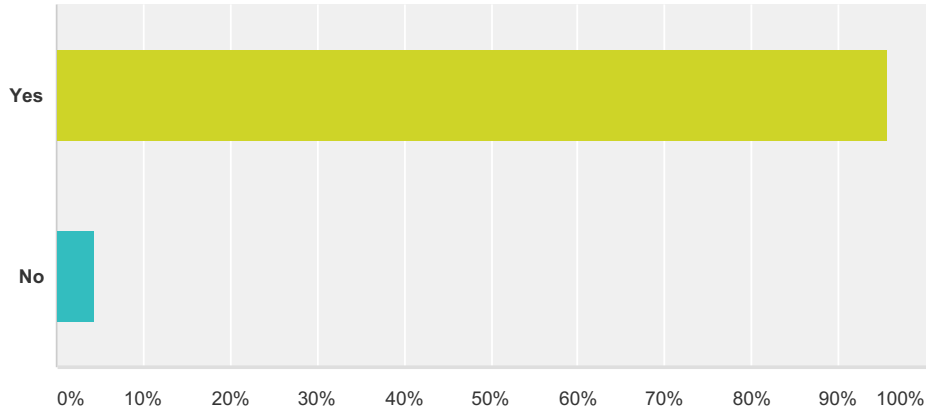

Q5 Would you be in favor of the coalition having short-term workgroups, active for 2 to 4 months, to coordinate specific coalition projects and/or events?

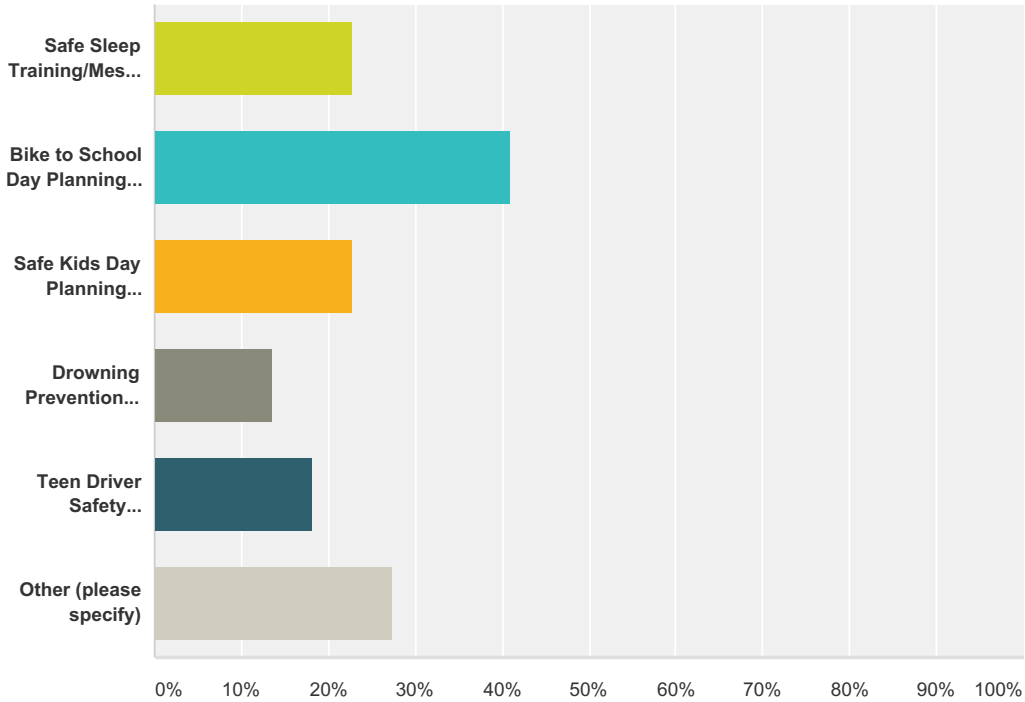

1	I would suggest the following: 1) Having workgroups, an executive team and community health workers (CHWs) as part of the coalition, 2) Establishing a vision and mission statement, 3) Choosing three broad topics to focus on that will encompass the work that members are already doing so that members are inclined to stay engaged, 4) Using information from other credible sources (i.e., CDC) to obtain "canned" messages and articles that can be used in social media, 5) Establishing a year-long calendar of "theme months" along with a timeline of activities, 6) Drawing on the knowledge and expertise of the members by having them to do presentations on how their work aligns with the coalitions mission, 7) Continuing to invite outside speakers, 8) Requesting active participation from members so that the work does not fall on the coordinator alone, and 9) Recruiting more members whose agenda/organization aligns with the mission of the coalition so that the vision is clearly understood and embraced by all.	12/7/2016 2:51 PM
